

# MARKET MACHINATIONS

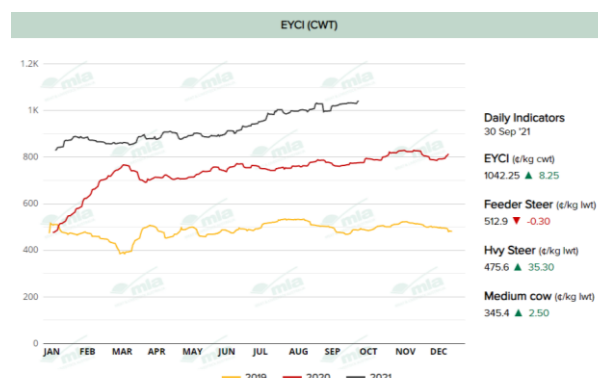
## Friday 1<sup>st</sup> October 2021



### WEEKLY COMBINED SALE on 28/09/2021

- Numbers continue to see saw at Roma with 30% less cattle on offer with 4906 head penned.
- Cattle were drawn from Boulia, Winton, Longreach, Cunnamulla, the central west, Warrego and Maranoa.
- Steers under 280kgs, lifted by 20c with increased southern competition to reach 706c (sold by Layershire P/L) most from 600-670c.
- Steers 280-400kg were firm to a shade easier with quality the main factor topping at 650c and ranging from 470-600c.
- Feeders 400-550kg sold from 380-550c and averaged 463c to be 10c dearer.
- Steers and bullocks for the export and trade processors sold from 380-478c.
- Heifers under 280kg were mixed and sold to a top of 670c (again by Layershire P/L) though most sold from 500-600c.
- Heifers 280-450kg were 10-20c dearer to reach 582c, most from 440-536c depending upon weight.
- Prime heifers sold from 368-390c (sold by the Phillips family).
- Preg tested heifers ranged from \$1700-\$2250 per head.
- Heavy cows over 520kgs sold from 342-377c to remain firm to a easier trend.
- Medium weight cows sold in a similar fashion ranging from 335-370c.
- Lightweight boners and store cows sold from 240-350c depending upon quality and condition.
- Bulls ranged from 330-374c.
- Cows and calves sold to \$2140 per unity in a very small offering.

### THE WEEK AHEAD

Scattered storms have made a welcome appearance across the Warrego and Maranoa this week. Being storm rain, the results have varied greatly but have been none the less welcome for producers lucky enough to have copped some. Falls have been from 10mms up with Falls recorded as high as 40mms up until Thursday afternoon. Hopefully this is the spring/summer break that has been absent for many years. BOM in their latest seasonal forecast for the 3 months up to the end of December are predicting a 50% chance of La Nina making an appearance. Good for Australian producers, but conversely not great for both North and South America. On the export front, Argentina is resuming exports to China from the 4<sup>th</sup> of October, a month earlier than expected. Brazil has been unable to get its beef exports back on track with access to China and a number of important destinations still leaving the South American powerhouse on the bench. The cattle market in Australia remains strong and a positive spring break won't hamper confidence.
