
MARKET MACHINATIONS Friday 27th October 2023

WEEKLY SALE for 24/10/2023

- The epicentre again saw numbers slip with 2997 mixed quality cattle penned.
- Cattle were again drawn from northern NSW, the Warrego and the Maranoa in a market that remains mixed.
- Steers under 280kg topped at 262c, to be firm to cheaper depending on quality, most making 200-260c.
- Steers 280-400kg were similar topping at 248c the bulk from 190-240c.
- Feeders fell again, XB's 200-224c, Bos Indicus types 170-200c.
- Steers and bullocks sold from 208to 232c in a cheaper market.
- Heifers under 280kg reached 162c, most from 100-152c.
- Heifers 280-330kg topped at 179c, selling from 100-172c.
- Feeder heifers 330-500kg were 8-10c dearer the best at 190c and sold from 120-180c.
- Processors paid from 123-184c for suitable heifers.
- Heavy cows over 520kg sold from 120-180c to remain firm.
- Cows 400-520kg sold from 100-180c to also remain firm.
- Lightweight boners and store cows sold from 60-100c.
- Bulls for the processors sold from 110-180c and live export from 140-221c.

THE WEEK AHEAD

Australia wide throughput continues to climb with MLA reporting more than 130,000 head were processed for the week ending 20/10. Queensland provided more than half the cattle processed. The female percentage of the throughput is also climbing to now sit at over 45%. Obviously, the supply chain is still slow with many producers frustrated by the snail like pace, particularly as the season across southern Queensland hasn't got any wetter. Scattered falls around many eastern areas of NSW have been received over the past 48 hours. Nice if you're under them! Many people are talking up the chance of some worthwhile November rain. Let's hope that the forecasts are more accurate than the local tipsters. Values for all classes of cattle are tending to vary more around quality as numbers in the physical markets are remaining tight. Interestingly, many southern centres are penning more cattle than the major southern Queensland markets, with values just about on par across the eastern states after the freight comes into consideration.
