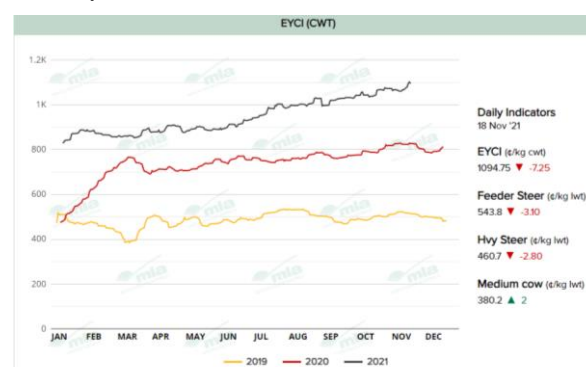

WEEKLY COMBINED SALE on 16/11/2021

- Numbers lifted by nearly 700 head for a mixed quality yarding of 2900 head.
- Cattle were drawn from Broken Hill to Mount Isa in the north after rain of 15mms to 200mms was recorded across southern Queensland.
- Steers under 280kg reached 810c (sold by Campmac) most selling from 640-746c.
- Steers 280-400kg topped at 716c though most sold from 560-640c.
- Feeders sold to 587c and ranged from 450-540c.
- Steers and bullocks suitable for the processors ranged from 451-465c.
- Heifers under 280kg sold to 696c and ranged from 554-684c depending upon quality.
- Heifers 280-450kg were 20-30c dearer reaching 684c (sold by CA Flower & Co) most from 480 to 591c.
- Heifers for the trade 396-460c.
- A small run of preg tested heifers returned \$1634 per head.
- Heavy cows over 520kgs were 10-12c dearer selling from 396-420c.
- Medium weight cows ranged from 372-416c.
- Lightweight boners and store cows sold from 320-342c.
- Heavy bulls sold from 328-400c.
- Cows and calves sold strangely for a small offering topping at \$3000 per unit.

THE WEEK AHEAD

Throughput declined further for the week ending the 12 November with 93,375 head being processed country wide falling 3708 head from the previous week. Queensland throughput also declined by over 2000 head. Rainfall across southern and central Queensland over the past week has been a terrific early start to hopefully see a return to a normal wet. Demand for all classes of store cattle remain strong. I do wonder though some buyers are losing sight of the end result when light weaners steers are making the same \$'s as cattle 50kg or heavier. Interestingly, in Roma last week restockers outbid feeders to buy the majority of the CA Flower & Co's annual draft of outstanding quality Santa, Santa/Hereford and Santa/Angus heifers. We haven't seen this occur for twenty years. Prime cattle are also selling strongly with most classes well in front of OTH quotes. Worldwide beef demand remains strong with the US being in a fortunate position of high supplies coupled with high demand both domestically and for export. An interesting question will be now, will Australia in particular claw back market share when supplies lift here.
