
MARKET MACHINATIONS Friday 1st February 2024

WEEKLY SALE for 30/01/2024

- After a weekend of scattered to useful falls across the drawing area, numbers fell at the epicentre with 2943 mixed quality cattle penned.
- Cattle were drawn from Blackall, Augathella, Dirranbandi, the Warrego and Maranoa in a market that saw feeders move higher, most of the balance firm to a shade dearer.
- Steers under 280kgs remained firm to reach 500c, most from 400-486c.
- Steers 280-400kgs topped at 464c, the bulk from 370-440c to be 8-10c dearer.
- Feeder were 10c dearer to top at 399c and average 381c.
- Steers and bullock remained firm to sell from 268-314c.
- Heifers under 280kgs were 10c stronger topping at 369 and ranged from 300-368c.
- Heifers 280-330kgs sold to 342c and averaged 327c to be 5c dearer.
- Feeder heifers 330-500kgs also moved higher to reach 338c, selling from 280-330c.
- Processors paid from 260 to 310c for suitable heifers.
- Heavy cows over 520kgs sold from 245-281c to be 5c better.
- Medium weight cows 450-520kgs made 224-280c, also 5c dearer.
- Lightweight boners and store cows sold from 196-238c.
- Bulls moved higher selling from 241-316c.
- Cows and calves topped at \$1600 per unit in a plainer offering.
