
MARKET MACHINATION Friday 12th July 2024

WEEKLY SALE for 9th July 2024

- Roma agents yarded 6530 head this week in what seemed to be a mixed quality varding.
- Cattle were drawn from Northern West NSW, Boulia, Kynuna, the Warrego and the Maranoa.
- Young lightweight steers under 280kgs were significantly dearer topping at 408c most from 330-360c, keeping in mind the ones in store condition.

- Steers 280-400kgs sold in a similar trend, reaching 388c to be 10-15c dearer and ranging from 318-378c.
- Feeders 400-500kgs were 15-20c dearer, topping at 366c, most making 330-340c.
- Processors paid from 250 to 300c for bullocks.
- Heifers under 280kgs were 5-10c stronger, depending on type most made from 255-310c.
- Backgrounder heifers were firm to 10c dearer topping at 310c to average 274c.
- Feeder heifers 330-500kgs were 10-15c dearer selling to 320c, most making from 250-280c depending on bred and if they had been Preg tested empty.
- Processors paid from 270-308c for slaughter heifers.
- Heavy cows over 520kgs sold from 250-300c to be 20c dearer.
- Medium weight cows 400-520kgs increased by 10-15c selling from 220-273c.
- Lightweight store and boners cows sold from 130-220c to be also 15-20c dearer.
- Heavy bulls for the processors sold from 200-274c to be dearer.
- Cows and calves were dearer and sold from \$1300 \$1800, as there was a genuine herd dispersal.
